## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### Welcome to 2019

Hope everyone has had a great break and a wonderful start to the 2019 year.

### Term One

Term One is a busy term as we plan for each student to be successful and have all the opportunities to be involved and enjoy their time at school. I welcome all the new students and their families to Belmont High School.

The year 7 students have transitioned well into their new school and feedback from students and teachers indicate that they are enjoying their time with us. Our Swimming Carnival occurs this week, and I look forward to a very exciting day with students and staff, where everyone gets into the House spirit by dressing in their colours and cheering the competitors from their House. This term our year 7 students attend their camp where they will learn more about each other and their teachers. Our Year 12 students returned from their camp last week. The focus of this camp was to enhance their connection as a House group and prepare them for leadership roles within their Houses. I look forward to working with all the student leaders across the school. Our students will continue to be offered opportunities to be involved in the large number of events this year and we will be encouraging them to get involved.

**The Performing Arts Centre** was officially opened on Thursday 7 February, by the Victorian Minister for Education, Mr James Merlino and Local Member for Geelong, Hon Christine Couzens. Our student leaders gave the minister a tour of our school and the new facility before the opening ceremony. Thank you to our student performers beginning with singer Sophia Warden who entertained our audience.

We are proud of our new Performing Arts Centre that is already being used extensively. Our classrooms are very large and allows music and drama classes the required space and resources to work effectively. Our new canteen is very modern and large and extensively used by our students.

**The demolition of our old toilets** has been delayed but should be demolished in the near future. **Our carpark** is still to be completed as well as the outdoor spaces outside the Performing Arts Centre.

We now have 6 extra classrooms; three in the Performing Arts Centre, two in the new Portable which is on the North side of the school in the Middle Years precinct, and a classroom adjacent to the new House Leaders Office. Our refurbished library also has senior study spaces, which will be extensively used by our Year 11 and 12 students.

## **Our New House Leaders Office**

We have organised our House Leaders to be in the one office to support a consistent approach to student engagement and wellbeing across the school, as well as supporting our students and staff in building high expectations in every classroom. The students understand the Respectful Relationship document that we had implemented last year. We expect all students to be ready to learn and any student that interrupts the learning or safety of the class will be addressed through a staged response that we call the 6 Rs. In essence, students will be given the opportunity to reflect on their behaviour and re-engage in the class. If students continue to misbehave, they will be sent to the House Leaders office where they will reflect on their behaviour and will be required to meet with their teacher and develop goals to prevent them from interrupting the class, in future. The process has been developed to help support all students and to maintain the high expectations in all classes.

## **Our Priorities**

We continue to focus on improving Writing across the school. Each class will have students practice their writing in every unit of study. Additionally, subject specific vocabulary and command terms will be taught to all students from Year 7 to 12. Middle Years will continue to collaborate together to ensure that the learning program is engaging and purposeful for all our students. Our Year 9 English and Mathematics classes have teams of teachers who are working together in each area to plan their program, using data which will support further engagement and improvement in writing and numeracy. Our Year 10 students now have electives that are 9 periods per fortnight. We want our Year 10 students to see themselves as part of the senior school. Teachers have spent a good deal of time last year to develop these new units. These electives should help students prepare for the rigour of VCE and VCAL.

Staff had the pleasure of listening to a presentation on Growth Mindset from James Anderson on our curriculum day this year. We will spend time planning activities to support this work. I look forward to a very successful 2019 year.

## **SCHOOL COUNCIL**

I am now calling for nominations for **School Council**. In this election period we have **4 Parent Vacancies** for a two year appointment, **2 DET Employee Member vacancies** and **1 Student Representative vacancy** for two year appointments. ## VCAL NEWS

It has been a busy start to the year for students in the VCAL program. Most students will start their Vocational Education and Training (VET) and School Based Apprenticeship/Traineeship (SBAT's) programs this week and have been preparing to start Community Service placements next week. The community placements are an important outcome for Personal Development Skills and further assist students with building employability skills. Year 12 VCAL students have started Certificate II VET Health Support Services run at the school by Antrick Education. Thank you to Dimity Leech (Lead Trainer/Assessor) for offering this fantastic opportunity to our students. It is an engaging program and the feedback from students has been positive. The program will run every second Tuesday. Literacy this year will focus on developing transferable skills with a range of engaging classroom activities to give students confidence to use these written and verbal skills at work and in the community. Next Monday February 11<sup>th</sup> all VCAL students will participate in a start to the year Personal Development program at Rippleside Park. This is always a great opportunity to set goals for the year and a way for students to get to know each other better. The day will include a BBQ lunch.

On behalf of all VCE staff I would like to welcome our VCE students and families to 2019, a year which I am sure will be full of hard work and very rewarding.

In the first week of school Year 11 and 12 students have attended meetings where expectations for the year were outlined, a summary of discussions are below:

- Use of **Compass** is expected and important information and forms will be communicated via this platform.
- All senior students have access to the **new senior study spaces** in the library. There is a collaborative room where students can work in small teams and a silent study space for independent work.
- All senior students are to use the library for their **study periods**. Students are required at school by 8.50am every day for form assembly, regardless of when their study periods fall.
- During the VET block (Wednesdays Period 5 & 6, and Fridays Period 5 & 6 – Week B) students are encouraged to use the resources available to them at school to further their learning. For Year 12s this includes opt-in **English and Maths tutorials**. Other formal sessions will be organised throughout the year and communicated to students in a timely manner – attendance is compulsory where requested.
- **Year 11 students** are required to attend assembly in the library every Friday Week B at the start of Period 5. Study periods in the library will follow this assembly and it is a requirement Year 11 students who do not study a VET program are in the school grounds at this time.
- **Attendance** in all classes is closely monitored to ensure students are meeting the minimum VCAA class time requirements. Students must provide adequate documentation for an absence to be 'VCE Approved', for example a medical certificate.
- It is an expectation students are completing **homework** regularly. For Year 11 students this is recommended at 10 hours per week, and for Year 12 student 15 hours per week.

### **YEAR 7 CAMP**

In the coming weeks, Year 7s will participate in a 3 day camp at Tanybryn. You will have received notification to pay and give consent via Compass. If you are having trouble logging on, please don't hesitate to contact the School for some assistance.

### **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE—Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per secondary school student is \$225.

#### **How to Apply:**

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the CSEF website.

### **PERSONAL GOODS BOUGHT TO SCHOOL**

Please be advised that private property bought to school by students is not insured by the school and the Department of Education does not accept any responsibility for loss or damage. This includes items such as mobile phones, calculators, sporting equipment, bicycles etc. Students are to provide appropriate security for all personal items, and the school will at all times endeavour to assist with this. It is appropriate if required, for students to request the Office or a Principal to look after certain items or sums of cash for short periods of time. Students are provided with lockers for storage and security and it is essential that all students provide a strong lock at all times for their lockers.

### **PICKING UP AND DROPPING OFF CHILDREN AROUND SCHOOLS**

For the safety of children, parents are reminded to take care and be mindful of increased vehicle and pedestrian traffic around the school, particularly at drop-off and pick-up times.

Please obey parking signs when picking up or dropping off children around schools as Council Parking & Information Officers regularly patrol school areas during start and finish times and motorists detected breaching parking regulations risk being issued with a Penalty Infringement Notice.

Remember, as soon as you stop to let your children in or out of the car, you are deemed to be parked. You do not have to leave your car or turn the engine off to be fined so please ensure you are parked in a legal parking area.

Nomination forms may be obtained from the school and must be lodged by **4.00pm** on **Monday 18<sup>th</sup> February 2019**.

In the event of the need for an election, the ballot will close at **4.00 pm** on **Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March 2019**.

Following the closing of nominations a list of the nominations received will be posted at the school.

The terms of office, membership categories and number of positions in each membership category open for election are as follows –

DET employee member	From the day after the date of the declaration of the poll in 2019 to and inclusive of the date of the declaration of the poll in 2021.	2 positions
Student elected representative	From the day after the date of the declaration of the poll in 2019 to and inclusive of the date of the declaration of the poll in 2021.	1 position

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, a notice to that effect and calling for further nominations will be posted in a prominent position at the school.

## SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2019

### ***What is a school council and what does it do?***

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

### ***Who is on the school council?***

There are four possible categories of membership:

**A mandated elected Parent category.** More than one third of the total members must be from this category.

Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not employed at the school.

**A mandated elected DET employee category.** Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

**An optional Community member category.** Its members are appointed by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members.

**Two student elected members.** Members of this category are nominated and elected by the school student body for a two year term. Year 12 students are eligible to nominate but serve only one year.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

### ***Why is Parent membership so important?***

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

### ***Do I need special experience to be on school council?***

Each member brings their own valuable life skills and knowledge to the role, councillors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

### ***How can you become involved?***

The most obvious way is to vote in the school council elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might seriously consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

### ***What do you need to do to stand for election?***

The principal will issue a notice and call for nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

DET employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work, are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the notice of election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

### **Remember**

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to school council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.
