Art	Art Materials	Consumable materials for Art which students take home: eg. Cartridge paper, Acrylic Paints, glue, pens, craft paper, Copic Markers, Inks, fine liners, drawing, materials for collage such as lino plates, block printing ink, tiles.	\$15
	Ceramics Materials	Consumable materials for Ceramics which students take home: eg. cartridge paper, drawing & painting materials, clay, oxides, under glazes, glazes and slips and plaster.	\$25
	Painting & Drawing Materials	Consumable materials for Art which students take home: eg. Drawing, printmaking and painting materials and printing, cartridge paper, acetate printing plates, canvas, ink, acrylic paints, specialised drawing materials.	\$15
	Visual Communication & Design Materials	Consumable materials for VCD which students take home: eg. Specialised paper, Cartridge paper, water coloured pencils, fine liners and drawing materials.	\$15

English	English Author Visit	Author visit. The insights from the author allow for students to improve their writing skills and understanding.	\$10
Health & PE	Physical Education Activities	Includes entrance and travel for Dance, Gymnastics, Supatramp, table tennis and tennis.	\$120
