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## Principal's Report

Our students are getting into the routine of being back onsite and attending classes ready to learn. I want to commend the students for their resilience this year, as they work towards the final term in 2021. The regular communication with students about our expectations and support for them has been a constant message in all assemblies and form group meetings.



During the term the elections of student leaders, House sport competitions and catch up of missed events, practical sessions and excursions, have helped make this term very busy and exciting. The year 11 students have started their exams and will conclude them this week. Their Early Commencement Program (ECP) will be starting next week. This is a time when that will start their Year 12 work in preparation for 2022.

In the last fortnight, our school has presented our data for the past four years to our community. Thank you to all the parents that attended. We value the feedback that was given and will use this to further improve our school.

Our students have attended year level assemblies where students were encouraged to get involved in school activities and participate in giving us feedback on how we can further improve the school experience for them. The Year 10 Assembly were presented with their Senior School badge and reminded that they are Senior Students that have a responsibility to be role models of our school values. The Year 11 students had a similar assembly as they work towards completing Year 11 and starting the Year 12 work next week.

Each assembly was presented with the student survey data and encouraged to join the focus groups. The students focus groups will be continuing this month. Students were invited to attend this group to give feedback on the student survey results and ways that we can support their transition to onsite learning and further improve their learning experience. All this feedback will be used to plan our next strategic plan when we have our review next term.



## It's not ok to be away

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Students develop good habits by going to school every day – habits that are necessary to succeed after school, whether in the workplace or in further study.

Missing school can have a big impact on students academically and socially. It can affect their test results, including VCE & VCAL, and, just as importantly, it can affect their relationships with other students, and lead to social isolation.

#### Top attendance tips for parents

- Schools want to work in partnership with parents act early if you have any concerns by contacting the school and ask for advice and support
- Remember that every day counts
- There is no safe number of days for missing school each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes and their social connectedness
- Talk positively about school and the importance of attending every day
- Open and prompt communication with your child's school about all absences is a good idea
- Avoid making routine medical and dental appointments during the school day or planning family holidays during the term
- Seek help from your school if you are concerned about your child's attendance and wellbeing. Schools want to work in partnership with parents to support student attendance and wellbeing.

## Year 7 Indonesian

In Year 7 Indonesian we have been learning about clothes and traditions. During the day, most people in Indonesia wear regular 'Western' clothing and traditional clothing is worn at wedding ceremonies or special parties. If a bride and groom come from different areas of Indonesia, they will usually begin the ceremony in a costume from one region and then later change into the costume representing the other region. There is lots of colour and even gold!

The sarung is a traditional item of clothing, worn by both men and women. It is cloth wrapped around the body and secured at the waist. After coming home from work, Indonesian men will have a mandi (shower) and then put on their sarung, worn with a light shirt. A kain is similar but is worn by men and women as a traditional outfit. In a nutshell sarung is casual, kain is for fancy parties.

We all had a try of wearing some traditional Indonesian clothing and tying a sarong in different styles. Everyone looked fantastic.




Remember it's never too late to try learning an instrument, and students from any year level are welcome to apply for a place in the program!
