


- You can study this VCE subject while at your current school and complete this extra study at Bellarine Secondary College.

### What does this course involve?

The Certificate III in Equine Studies is designed to prepare secondary school students for employment in equine or related animal industries. This course comprises of a combination of theory classes at Bellarine SC and practical training, structured workplace and presentations by guest speakers from industry at an accredited Equestrian Centre. This course teaches routine horse husbandry to achieve optimum horse health and performance. Students will participate in horse riding, develop skills to prepare a horse for competition, learn how to identify desirable and poor conformation in horses, lameness and how it may affect gait and performance. Students will also learn how to implement feeding programs, monitor the quality of feed

and recognise individual feeding habits of horses.

## What employment opportunities will I have?

This course may provide you with employment opportunities as an animal attendant, stable or stud hand, horse breeder, mounted police, veterinary nurse or coach. You may also find employment opportunities in racing or retail.

# What further study options will I have?

You may wish to progress into the Certificate III in Agriculture (Horse Breeding) or Diploma level equine courses. You can also study animal welfare, coaching and racing certificates.

### Recognition

- The Certificate III in Equine Studies is a VETiS course. Secondary school students may receive credit towards satisfactory completion of their VCE Vocational Major (VM) or a score towards their VCE. Assessments for both VCE and VM are based on Practical Competence and Theoretical Knowledge.
- The VCE/VM component is delivered under Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA).
